



PJA statement concerning corruption charges

The Professional Jockeys Association said that they were aware of the on-going British Horseracing Authority's (BHA) investigations relating to these Jockeys but were only informed recently that charges were imminent. The PJA has now recommended that the Jockeys in question seek legal representation. The PJA stressed that on any issues concerning integrity, which is vital to the sport of horse racing, it will continue to support the BHA in carrying out that function.

Until this case is concluded, the PJA, as the trade body for Jockeys, will continue to offer advice and support to the five Jockeys should they seek it.
